The London Clinic is an independent acute hospital situated in the heart of London's medical community on Harley Street, London, UK. The cancer treatment centre at 21 Devonshire Place in London opened in December 2009. External beam radiotherapy is performed using a Varian Trilogy, Varian IX and Accuray Cyberknife. Imaging support is provided by existing in-house CT, MR, and PET/CT. Treatment planning systems include Eclipse and Multiplan systems; Aria and IMPAC record and verify and patient management systems will be used in this paperless treatment facility. Conformal radiotherapy, IMRT, VMAT, IGRT, respiratory gating (including DIBH), SRS, SRT and CT planned TBI are offered. Future plans include the introduction of HDR brachytherapy, VMAT TBI, Vision RT DIBH, 3T functional MRI and gated VMAT.

This position represents an opportunity to be at the forefront of the latest developments in radiation oncology. The increased project workload means we are now looking for an additional Staff Physicist. A Staff Physicist will be expected to become familiar with all aspects of radiotherapy treatment delivery employing the Clinic's equipment and use this knowledge to educate, organise and train other members of the physics and radiotherapy department's staff. Technical and scientific guidance for the remainder of the radiotherapy staff is expected. Medical physics research and clinical research support will be required. The department will also actively support candidates who are willing to register for a relevant part time P.h.d, including protected time.

Candidates should have or be eligible for state registration and have at least 2 years experience in a radiotherapy physics setting. A candidate with less experience will be considered if dedication and talent can be adequately demonstrated. The team currently consists of 5 Physicists and 3 Dosimetrists.

The Clinic has an excellent Clinical Training and Practice Development department and strongly supports continuing professional development and education.

Staff benefits include a contributory pension scheme, a private healthcare plan, life assurance and an interest-free season ticket loan.
