Job summary:

- The Chief of Department will be responsible for assisting Marie Curie Hospital and Daruieste Viata NGO in developing and implementing the radiation oncology service, supporting the overall oncology service, the needs of the cancer patient during the entire continuum of care, and improving operations in terms of quality and processes in radiation oncology.
- Will lead the strategic and operational business functions of the Radiation Oncology service line.
- Will provide direction and support for the on-going development of a comprehensive radiation oncology initiative as it relates to the full oncology service line development for the department. In partnership with key division personnel, hospital administrative teams and physicians, conceives and develops strategy, promotes operational standards, and ensures that radiation oncology services are coordinated across the Oncology services.
- Will collaborate with site leaders and physicians to implement policies, procedures and operational workflows that reduce treatment variation.
- Will have oversight of information system utilization, ensuring information systems support operations and providers in an effective, efficient and standardized manner. Manages the tracking and reporting mechanisms to monitor the progression of operation, quality and safety measures as it relates to the radiation oncology service line across the Department
- Will coordinate clinical staff meetings and attends medical staff committee meetings as assigned or requested.
- Will facilitate the planning process and implementation activities with the Marie Curie Hospital and Daruieste Viata NGO leadership.
- Directly manages the Chief Physicist and Chief Therapist the consolidate the Radiation Oncology Program
