Overview of the Post

- Ensure the provision of quality patient care, whilst maximising efficiency in accordance with company policies and procedures
- Main Responsibilities Include:
 - 1. Maintains an atmosphere of caring, concern and support for patients.
 - 2. Completes patient assessment within a time frame laid down in Departmental policy.
 - 3. Communicates to inpatient staff and referring physicians treatment related information as needed.
 - 4. Assists with scheduling of required outpatient lab tests, x-rays, scans, etc. as needed.
 - 5. Maintains standards in all aspects of work, with reference to current standards of practice.
 - 6. Maintains current BLS skills and attend all in-house health and safety training (e.g. fire, manual handling etc.) as required.
 - 7. Performs related responsibilities as required by the Chief of Department

Skills Essential to the Post

- Current registration with Colegiul Medicilor
- Registration with CNCAN permit level 2 will be required upon employment
- Must possess competent clinical and interactive skills with pediatric and adult patients.
- Function well in a team environment both as a participant as well as in a leadership role.
- Flexible and adaptable approach to work.
- Experience of working with multi-disciplinary teams.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills and the ability to motivate, influence, inspire and encourage different ways of working.
- Ability to prioritise and to deliver to short deadlines.
- Completion of Mandatory Training as required by Department Policy,



Qualifications/ Documentation: will be required and verified upon successful completion of the interview

Experience:

- Appropriate post registration clinical experience
- Experience in Pediatric Oncology suitable
- Experience with IMRT , SRS/SBRT and 4D treatments suitable

General Personal Competencies:

- Provision of an open caring environment for all referred patients, where proper explanation of treatment approach, careful treatment delivery and appropriate follow up is provided.
- A high level of flexibility to ensure the delivery of an effective and efficient service. Therefore, the post holder will be required to demonstrate flexibility as and when required by the Chief of Department.
- Maintain strict confidentiality with patient and employee or any other information in accordance with the Hospital and Departmental policies and procedures.

Clinical Duties:

- Provision of consultative services within the scope of the Departmental Policy for the provision of consultation in the inpatient and outpatient settings,
- Thorough clinical evaluation, careful explanation to patients and family and considered and collaborative decision making is necessary for the proper delivery of radiation oncology services to the patients referred to our facility.

Radiation Treatment Planning:

- Through the use of the Radiotherapy Treatment Booking Form, accurate and complete requests for the planning process is required for each patient.
- The provision, with the appropriate assistance of Dosimetrist and Physicist support, of contouring for the purpose of treatment planning.
- Participation with Medical Physics staff in the process of treatment planning.
- Full plan evaluation and plan sign off according to the prescribed planning care nath
- Provision of accurate and thorough documentation of the planning philosophy and process



Radiation Treatment Delivery:

- In line with the relevant departmental policy, it is a requirement, where
 possible, for there to be a Physician on site at all times while patients are
 receiving radiation treatment.
- A Physician needs to be on site, or accessible, to answer planning and treatment related queries, including field checks, on set mark-up etc.
- Physicians will participate in offline review of treatment delivery, in conjunction with nominated senior Radiation Therapists and Physicists. Accurate and complete, legible record keeping.
- Timely maintenance of Physician related administrative function
- Timely attention to the various stages of planning documentation.
